#### DR. ROBIN RAYFIELD TO SPEAK AT PCRTA LUNCH ON MARCH 15, 2018

Dr. Rayfield, the new Executive Director of ORTA, retired from the superintendent's position at Pike Delta York Local in 2012 after 31 years as a classroom teacher, assistant principal, principal, university

professor and superintendent, mostly in northwest Ohio. After retirement he worked at two universities, Findlay and Ohio University. Dr. Rayfield, who has been married to his wife, Stephanie, for 30 years, has three children: Ryan, Reid and Ross. He is a member of the Ohio Wrestling Coaches Hall of Fame and the National Wrestling Hall of Fame. His topic will be: What Is Going On at ORTA (changes

Helena Parry gave the ORTA Trustee Report from the meeting on October 27, 2017. Dr. Robin Rayfield, the new Excutive Director, presented some of his major goals:

<u>Goal 1:</u> ORTA will work improving financial conditions for STRS recipients. <u>Goal 2:</u> ORTA will work towards the continuation of affordable and functional health care programs available to STRS beneficiaries. <u>Goal 3:</u> ORTA will work to increase membership across the state.

#### PCRTA NOVEMBER 9, 2017, MEETING CONTINED

The year- long work of the ORTA Strategic Planning Committee, Co-Chaired by Dave Gynn and Bea Lehner, resulted in changes to the structure and governance of the organization.
